Is your child in **8th grade** in Charlotte County Public Schools?

Does your child have **at least a "C" in every class**?

Does your child have an **overall 2.5 GPA**?

Does your **family's income fall within the guidelines** below?

INCOME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

Effective from July 1, 2011 to Jun 30, 2012

*You MUST report your TOTAL income before taxes, social security, health benefits, union dues, or other deductions. Your income includes alimony, child support, pensions, etc.

"Household Size" includes ALL ADULTS who live in the home, whether they are a relative or not.

If you answered YES to all 4 questions above, then
your child may be eligible for a college tuition scholarship
to be awarded in Charlotte County during the 2011-2012 school year!

Applications:

Your child can pick up an application at the guidance office at your school.

**Applications are due to the Guidance Office at your school
by Noon on Tuesday, September 20, 2011.**

Student Selection:

Applications are reviewed by a Student Selection Committee made up of community volunteers, as well as guidance counselors from your child's school.

Students accepted into the program must:

- Get a "C" or above in every class and maintain an overall 2.5 GPA –
- Remain free of drugs, alcohol, crime, and gang activities –
- Meet with their assigned adult mentor (if available) each week at school –

Participants who successfully complete the program receive:

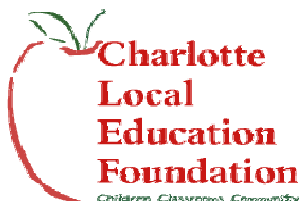
FREE TUITION for 2 years at a community college**

AND

FREE TUITION for 2 years at a state university**

**The student must attend one of the 28 public community colleges and one of the 11 public universities in Florida
–or– the student has the option to attend one of 40+ accredited vocational-technical schools in Florida.

Note that the scholarship is for tuition only and does not cover the cost of fees, books, food, housing, uniforms, etc.
